The Kormilda College Performing Arts Department endeavours to provide an environment where it is possible to take private tuition in a variety of disciplines:

MUSIC

- » Piano
- » Drums
- » Acoustic Guitar
- » Electric Guitar, Bass Guitar
- » Woodwind: Flute, Clarinet, Saxophone
- » Vocal: Contemporary
- » Recorder
- » Strings - violin, viola, cello
- » Music Appreciation (Transition students)

DANCE

- » HipHop
- » Contemporary

External teachers provide private tuition. The contribution of the external teachers is acknowledged as fundamental to the development of the Performing Arts students and the success of ensemble activities. Availability of string instruction is subject to student enrolment levels.

Timetable

All lessons are 25 minutes and are held on a weekly basis. Lessons are held during school hours and in Primary School are run on a rotational basis each semester in order to minimise disruption to classes.

Students receive a timetable at the commencement of lessons. It is the student's responsibility to attend lessons and keep a practice diary.

Fees and Charges

- » Enrolment is by term and students will be automatically re-enrolled unless the College is advised otherwise.
- » Failure to pay fees on time may result loss of place in the program.
- » 48 hours notification in advance is required to cancel a lesson.

Purchase and Hire of Equipment

Instruments and music can be purchased or hired (instruments only) through retail outlets such as Musiccorp, Casuarina Sounds of Music, Billy Hyde Top End Sounds Pro Shop, and the CYM Shop, amongst others found in the Yellow Pages. It is advisable to consult with the respective teacher before hiring or purchasing an instrument. Dance attire can be purchased from suppliers. Suitable equipment for private tuition is the responsibility of the parent/guardian.

Examinations

Reports are provided for all students learning with a tutor at the end of each semester. External examinations (eg. AMEB) may be undertaken subject to recommendation of the individual teacher.

Ensembles and Bands

Students learning an instrument are required to participate in at least one school ensemble and perform at a College event during the year.

Students can participate in the following ensembles and bands:

- » Student Choice Ensembles
- » Percussion Band
- » Choir
- » Dance Troupe

Terms and Conditions – Please complete with your child

Students taking Performing Arts tuition are required to do so for a minimum of one semester. Lessons will commence in the second week of each semester.

- Fees and charges: \$35 per lesson charged in advance each term
- No refunds unless under exceptional circumstances.
- Students are automatically re-enrolled for each term of the current year unless the College is notified of termination a full term prior to leaving.
- Students must purchase all books, accessories, etc. as directed by the instrumental/vocal/dance tutor.
- Examinations are highly recommended as they provide a set of goals for each student and are an excellent measure of progress. Australian Music Examinations Board (AMEB) advice is available for students from the teacher should they wish to do these examinations.

- Students learning all instruments must have a suitable instrument available for daily practice.
- All students who enrol in private instrumental tuition through the school are expected to join at least one ensemble or band.
